INTRODUCTION









Annually, throughout the month of October, UN-Habitat encourages countries, cities, communities, individuals, and institutions to discuss ways to improve the quality of life in urban areas. This global initiative, known as Urban October, starts with World Habitat Day on the first Monday of the month - celebrated on October 2 in 2023 – and ends with World Cities Day on October 31.

Urban October aims to raise awareness and stimulate discussions about the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which were adopted in 2015 by the 193 Member States of the United Nations. There's a special focus on SDG 11, providing an opportunity for individuals and institutions to organize events and participate in discussions addressing the challenges and opportunities in urban environments.

To fuel conversations on Urban October themes, the UN-Habitat office in Brazil created the Urban Circuit in 2018: an initiative to bring visibility and institutional support to events organized by various stakeholders throughout the country. Since then, the initiative has supported the realization of nearly a thousand events, making Brazil a leader among countries celebrating Urban October!

In its 6th edition, the Urban Circuit received support from the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) affiliated to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MRE) and featured virtual, in-person, and hybrid events from Latin America and Lusophone Africa.

The theme was "Investing in Urban Futures: Cooperation for Global South Resilience", divided into four thematic lines:

- Integrated urban planning;
- Financing and investment:
- Social and economic inclusion;
- Circular economy.








149 (73%) out of the 203 events were specifically planned for the Urban Circuit, and 60% of this year's proponents also hosted events in previous editions.





Audience Profile










2023 Urban Circuit's audience was predominantly composed of Brazilian young people and women.





UN@HABITAT

The United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat) was established in 1978 following the United Nations Conference on Human Settlements (Habitat I). Based in Nairobi, Kenya, the programme serves as the UN's focal point for sustainable urbanization and human settlements, with the goal of promoting socially, economically, and environmentally sustainable urban development.

Since 1996, the Regional Office for Latin America and the Caribbean has been situated in Rio de Janeiro. The UN-Habitat office for Brazil and the Southern Cone is also located in Rio de Janeiro, and features a dedicated team overseeing all initiatives, projects, and activities within Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Paraguay, and Uruguay.



In 1987, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MRE) created the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) to plan, coordinate, negotiate, approve, implement, follow up and evaluate technical cooperation programs, projects and activities for the purpose of development in all fields of knowledge, be these actions undertaken by Brazil abroad or from abroad to Brazil in the bilateral, trilateral or multilateral modalities. Since 2019, it has taken on the responsibility of overseeing humanitarian cooperation initiatives promoted by the Brazilian government. To carry out its mission, ABC follows the MRE foreign policy guidelines, as well as the national development priorities defined in the multi-annual plans and sectoral government programs.
